




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OCRE will drive adoption of digital services and close the gap between the supply and demand sides






Key points

- OCRE stimulates the adoption of commercial digital services by the European Research community
- OCRE frameworks provide the portfolio of commercial services for EOSC (European Open Science Cloud)
- The national dimension: The OCRE laaS+ framework creates a portfolio of cloud services in each European country, adapted to particular local circumstances but governed by the same rulebook (FW contract and procurement)
- The frameworks will support the procurement of digital services by both individual institutions and buyer groups
- The project will make available €4.75 million in EC adoption funding to the research community to consume cloud related resources from suppliers on the laaS+ framework





Research and Education community

KEY BENEFITS

- ✓ Validated cloud services which meet the community's needs
- Confirmed data privacy, contracting, billing integration, technical support and special pricing
- ✓ Integrated with the European Open Science Cloud
- Ready-to-use agreements (no need to run their own tenders)
- Apply for EC adoption funds available via OCRE (eligible research projects)



OCRE Cloud tender

General Information

- Published April 15 2020 Open European Procedure. Following Dutch public procurement regulations (AW12)
- GÉANT is the Central Purchasing Body on behalf of all listed entities
- Divided in 40 Lot's -> 1 country = 1 lot
- Tender and all documents accessible via GÉANT eProcurement portal www.supply2.geant.org (Negometrix)


Objective

- Stimulate the use of Cloud Services, especially in countries where usage is still limited
- Offer all eligible participants across Europe easy access to a variety of state of the art Cloud services via reliable and professional service providers against T&C's fitting the R&E Community.
- Offer users local support (e.g. consultancy, engineering, project management, invoicing) in all 40 countries.
- Eliminate administrative and bureaucratic procedures as much as possible
- Offer both SME's and Global Suppliers equal opportunities to provide services to the R&E Community



Tender Structure

- Every country (NREN) is a lot
 - gets its own framework agreements
 - offers can be different
- Every cloud platform receives a framework agreement
 - Hyperscaler via one supplier per lot
 - Original Infrastructure Providers (OIPs) bid directly
- 1 provider per platform per lot
 - 1 supplier per hyperscaler





NREN Role

Role	Description	What Institution Can Do
Referer	Acts as intermediary by making the framework agreements available in its respective country and facilitating connected institutions in purchasing from Suppliers (direct delivery model). The NREN does not sit in the contracting line.	Directly acquire and use the cloud services from the suppliers.
Underwriter	Makes purchases from Suppliers (on behalf of its connected institutions) and distributes the acquired resources across its community (institutions and end users). The NREN sits in the contracting line and is seen as the only call-off Customer towards the Supplier.	Use the cloud services made available through its NREN.



Tender Minimum Requirements

- GDPR (DSGVO) mandatory
- Additional data protection agreements cannot be regulated across the EU.
- Call Off Contract according to national, i.e. Austrian law.
- If there is an increased need for data protection, a minicompetition can be used

Awarding Criteria

- Evaluated centrally by the OCRE (GÉANT) tender team
 - GÉANT, DFN, HEAnet, SURF, Uninett
- Several bidders per platform are ranked
- Scores are reused in selection processes

Awarding Criteria - AC		Weight
AC 1	Service and Support	15%
AC 2	Marketing, adoption Support	25%
AC 3	Exit Support	5%
AC 4	Price. laaS / PaaS / SaaS discount	35%
AC 5	Price. Additional Services	5%
AC 6	Price. Additional Services	5%
AC 7	Sustainability	10%



Tender Results

Tender results in **framework agreements** with suppliers who meet the tender requirements. Not 1 winner takes all. Portfolio of services.

GÉANT has signed the framework agreements with the suppliers valid for 4 years.


Entities identified in the tender are eligible to use these framework agreements: to buy resources, via **call-off agreements**. This can involve a mini-competition procedure.



Legal

Open Procedure according to Dutch AW12 (implementing 2014/24/EU)







Direct Award

Without reopening competition.

Only <u>one</u> Provider can fulfil requirements.

Documentation of decision criteria is essential.

GÉANT provide the tool SelectionbyNeeds.xlsx

Desktop Mini-Competition

When requirements can be satisfied by multiple Suppliers.

Self-service exercise, requiring no or very limited additional active input from the Suppliers

Optionally adjust the relative weighting of Awarding Criteria

GÉANT provide the tool Austria DesktopMini.xlsx

Regular Mini-Competition

If no offer fully meets the actual customer requirements.

Customers can organise a regular Mini-Competition.

Reopening competition and requiring further input from Suppliers.

Invite <u>all Suppliers</u> in its Lot to participate.



Direct Award

A direct award can be carried out in accordance with the Federal Procurement Act (BVergG):

- 1. If a contract already existed before. You can use the Direct Award if it would not be economically or technically viable to appoint a different framework provider without significant inconvenience or cost to the Customer.
- 2. If the contract volume remains below 100,000 Euros in 4 years.
- 3. If only <u>one</u> Provider can fulfil requirements; documentation of decision criteria is essential.

And of course a Direct Award can be given if the purchasing organization is not subject to the BVergG.
